(58) CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES.

(59) RESOLUTIONS OF SYMPATHY.

On the motion of Mr. J. Ganl, seconded by Mr. T. McCarthy, a resolution was passed expressing sympathy with the relatives of the late Mr. D. Barry, General Manager and Secretary, Irish Tourist Association.

On the motion of Mr. J. Leary, seconded by Mr. P. Colfer, a resolution was passed expressing sympathy with the relatives of the late Mr. Aidan Mernagh, former member of this Council.

On the motion of Mr. P. Colfer, seconded by Mr. J. Leary a resolution was passed expressing sympathy with Dr. Ffrench, M.O., Fethard, on the death of his brother.

(60) COUNTY COUNCILS' GENERAL COUNCIL.

(62) MEMBERS' TRAVELLING EXPENSES.

A letter was read from the Department of Local Government approving the Council's proposal for payment of travelling expenses at the rate of 6d. per mile.

It was proposed by Mr. P. Colfer, seconded by Mr. J. Sinnott and resolved, that the sanction of the Minister for Local Government be requested to payment of travelling

expenses under Section 67(2) of the Local Government Act 1946, at 9d. per mile.

(63) MENTAL HOSPITAL VISITING COMMITTEE.

The report of the Mental Hospital Visiting Committee dated the 9th March, 1947, was submitted and adopted on the motion of Mr. M. Redmond seconded by Mr. J. Doran.

(64) SLAUGHTERHOUSE BYE-LAWS.

On further consideration of the question of making Bye-Laws in regard to Slaughterhouses, it was decided on the motion of Mr. J. Gaul, seconded by Mr. T. Byrne that the matter be adjourned.

It was further decided on the motion of Mr. T. McCarthy, seconded by Mr. T. Redmond (New Ross), that the Council's Solicitor be instructed to advise as to the duty of the Council to make Bye-Laws and the effect of such Bye-Laws in relation to existing slaughterhouses; and that copies of draft Bye-Laws be sent to all members on receipt of the opinion of the Council's Solicitor.

(65) ROSSLARE WATER SUPPLY - AREA OF CHARGE.

It was proposed by Mr. T. Byrne, seconded by Mr. S. O'Byrne and resolved that the Council recommend that the area of charge for the expenses of improvement to the Rosslare Water Supply shall be the County Health District of Wexford.

(66) TURF SCHEME.

The County Manager reported that an arrangement had been made with contractor for the cutting of turf in Moneer Bog.
